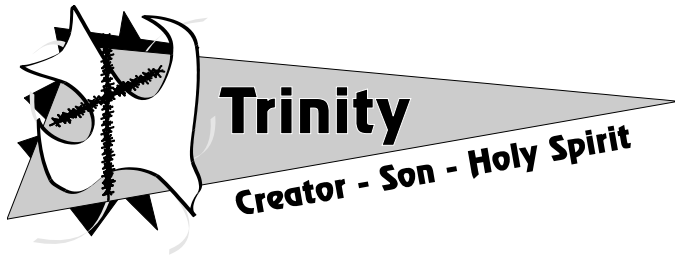

### **Being Catholic?** by Dan Beltram

Father John Catoir, in his column in The Beacon, the Diocese of Paterson Newspaper, a few weeks ago wrote about why Catholics leave the Church. He offered a number of reasons. Among them, he listed the human element of the church. He went on to say that many of them have been hurt, offended or scandalized by the clergy. If I may be so presumptuous to add an idea to Father Catoir's thoughts, it would be that these people never really knew WHY they were Catholic in the first place. Father Catoir goes on to say that it is "better to speak more to God about them, than to them about God." This was the advice St. Ambrose gave to St. Monica, the mother of St. Augustine, when he lapsed into heresy as a young man. She preserved in her prayers, and he eventually became a saint.

Many of us have no idea why we are Catholic, nor do we give it much thought. If we were asked the question, Why are you a Catholic? - we would not be able to give a satisfactory answer. Many of us were baptized as Catholics when we were little babies and raised in a Catholic family and continue living our lives in the Catholic religion. After the euphoria of adopting the catholic religion has worn off many converts also settle into the every day task of being a good Catholic. We never ask ourselves the question, WHY CATHOLIC? We live our daily lives, we attend Mass on Sunday and holy days of obligation. Some of us are fortunate enough to be able to attend daily mass. We receive the Sacraments on a regular basis. At Mass we receive the Holy Eucharist. We try to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation as much as possible - and life goes on.

When I was asked to be part of the WHY CATHOLIC Program I was very flattered. Then to be asked to be a small group leader that was as they say too much. I immediately said yes. Then I said, "What did I get myself into? Would I be a good leader, would I be prepared? Could I really do this? After a few training sessions my mind was put at ease. Yes, I could do this.

The WHY CATHOLIC program is not Bible Study. It is much more. You might even say it is Catechism for adults. The WHY CATHOLIC program extends beyond its name. The program could have been called BEING CATHOLIC. The Why Catholic program helps us to make our faith a big part of our daily lives. Recently, I received a wonderful gift. It is a piece of stone, on it is written, "Good Morning! This is GOD I will be handling all your problems today. I will not need your help. So have a good day! I love you! It is on my kitchen table for me to see every morning. Need I say more?

WHY CATHOLIC is a twelve week annual program divided into two six week sessions. One in the Spring and one in the Fall. Last spring we discussed topics such as our Desire for God, Tradition and Scripture, The Trinity, and the Incarnation. In the fall our discussion will take us to The Public Life of Jesus, Jesus' Death and Resurrection, the Holy Spirit and the Church and much, much more.

A typical session might go like this. We start with a prayer. Then we read from the appropriate scripture. There is a discussion about that scripture. Sometimes we refer to the Catechism of the Catholic Church for further discussion. We adopt ways to live our faith, an individual or group action that flows from our discussion. Actions that we can practice during the week; something that says we know WHY we are Catholic.

So, join us in the Fall. Try us on for size. I think you will like the way we fit. And, maybe like me, you will finally know the answer to the question, "WHY CATHOLIC?"

Thank you for your generosity!! We collected \$1,980.22 for Operation Rice Bowl and 115 bottles of vitamins!
