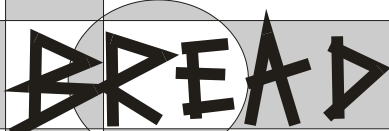

 Changes in Listing**



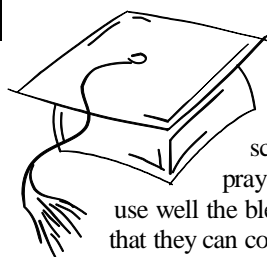
We welcome you to call the rectory to place names on our Prayers for the Sick List. Due to privacy laws, we ask that only immediate family members call us – or that you have the permission of the family before you place a friend's name on the list. We will then put the person's name in our Prayer of the Faithful during mass for 2 weeks and place the name in the bulletin for 3 weeks. After that it will be removed unless we receive a call renewing it for another 3 weeks. Please note that current names on the list will be removed 5 weeks from today unless we are notified.

MARIAN WALL - Memorializing

As we all know, our Blessed Mother holds many magnificent titles in the church, but of course her first and primary role was to be the mother of our Savior. I plan to create a Marian Wall in our church using the brick beveled wall where the images of Mary and Joseph and our Lady of Perpetual Help are presently. First, the present image of the Lord in honor of Divine Mercy will be moved to the wall by the Reconciliation Room and the image of the Holy Family will be appropriately placed in the Children's Prayer Room. The image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help will stay on the wall and I will move to the wall the framed image of our Lady of Czestochowa (signed by John Paul II which is now hung in the Atrium). Then I will add newly created Tapestries of Our Lady of Knock and Our Lady of Guadalupe.

I have commissioned Bramante Studios in Toronto Canada to create the new images of Our Lady of Knock and Our Lady of Guadalupe into tapestries similar to the Tapestry of the Sacred Heart (just inside the doors to the sanctuary). Sample photo's can be viewed in our atrium. I would like to offer to anyone who would be interested in memorializing a loved one, or an intention for themselves, to contact the rectory by September 1st. The gift level will begin at \$500 and can be paid in installments.

Social Security Father's Day Gift Suggestion

This Father's Day consider doing something for Dad that can really make a difference. Show him how he can get extra help with his Medicare prescription drugs through Social Security's "EXTRA HELP MEDICARE" program. If Dad is on Medicare and has an individual annual income of \$16,245 or less or Dad and his spouse has a combined annual income of \$21,855 or less he (they) may be eligible for Social Security to pay part of his (their) monthly premiums, annual deductibles, and prescription co-payments. On behalf of the residents and Board of Trustees of Birth Haven, thank you so very much for your very generous donation of a car seat and baby supplies. Birth Haven is a small, 9-bed non profit (501c3) organization providing transitional housing to young pregnant women who are without a safe or suitable living environment, such a donation is indeed a godsend. The majority of our clients come from abusive homes or relationships, and find themselves with nowhere to turn. We provide a family-like refuge, education – including life skills – counseling, access to medical care, and nurturing acceptance to these young women who have chosen to carry their pregnancies to term. The women and their infants may stay at Birth Haven for a usual six weeks following the birth of their babies.

The Board is committed to ensure that each resident at Birth Haven continues with education leading to a high school diploma or equivalency. Most women are delighted to have this opportunity to get a “second chance” while they await the birth of their baby. Those women who have already achieved this educational goal must commit to obtaining employment or a volunteering opportunity while they are at Birth Haven.

Most Holy Body and Blood

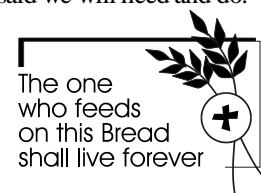
“Taking the book of the covenant, he read it aloud to the people, who answered, ‘All that the Lord has said, we will heed and do.’ Then he took the blood and sprinkled it on the people, saying, ‘This is the blood of the covenant that the Lord has made with you in accordance with all these words of His.’”

We celebrate this day which makes us a truly special people. Chosen by God, we are offered a chance to respond to His invitation to be the people peculiarly His own. As the people accepted the invitation of Moses, we too listen to and observe the words of the covenant: the Ten Commandments. Moses was the mediator and the people responded. We understand the terms of the agreement and commit ourselves to carry them out. God took the initiative, explained the requirements and conditions and we said ‘yes.’ He then sealed it with His blood.

The prophet Jeremiah spoke of the ‘new covenant,’ not carved on stone but written in the heart. Jesus came to initiate that covenant and as He met with His friends for the Last Supper He told them to ‘do this in memory of me.’ Every time we celebrate the Eucharist we renew the one covenant sealed in His Blood... We are fed with the gift of the Lord Himself. Jesus is the mediator of the new covenant and we respond with deep faith in His real presence among us.

On this day we call by the Latin name ‘Corpus Christi’ may we express our thanks for the gift of the Eucharist, ask the Lord to make us worthy to receive Him, and to deepen our faith in the wonderful mystery which unites us with Christ and one another.

What the Lord has said we will heed and do.
