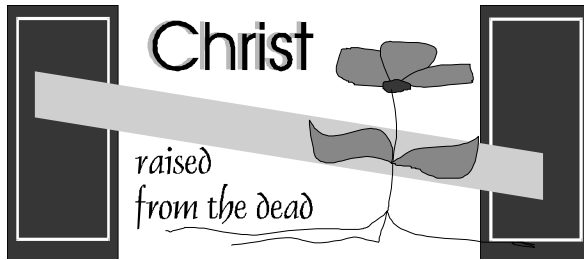

**ASH WEDNESDAY**



Wednesday, February 17<sup>th</sup> will be Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the Lenten Season. Mass will be celebrated at 6:30AM, 8:30AM, 12:05PM and 7:30PM. Ashes will be distributed during each mass (after the homily). Ashes will also be distributed at the 4:30PM Liturgy of the Word.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS**



We would like to call to your attention that every Friday in Lent we have the traditional devotion of the Stations of the Cross. It is a time when we as a community gather to reflect on the Lord's journey of His agony and crucifixion to which He submitted Himself for the forgiveness of our sins. When we prayerfully reflect on the "way of the cross" we come to understand the great love the Lord has for us, and hopefully appreciate even more, the gifts of His Resurrection, which we celebrate on Easter Sunday. Please make plans to join us to celebrate the Stations of the Cross on Fridays in Lent at 4PM.

**LENTEN REGULATIONS**

**FAST AND ABSTINENCE**

The specific discipline of the Church of the United States regarding penitential days is as follows:

1. The days of fast and abstinence are **ASH WEDNESDAY** and **GOOD FRIDAY**.
2. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance. This may be physical mortification or acts of religion, charity, or Christian witness.

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obligated to fast, by this obligation the individual is permitted only one full meal in the day. At the age of 14, people are obligated to abstain. The law of abstinence forbids the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products, or condiments of any kind even though made from animal fat. The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence (unsubstantially or as a whole) is a serious obligation.

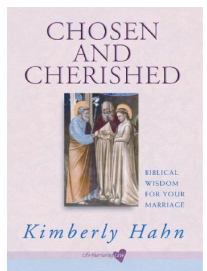

**FAQ's - Below are some frequently asked questions about the sacrament:**

**Won't the priest remember what I said? I'm embarrassed/don't want him to think badly of me.**

The priest's purpose is not to keep a check-list on people, but to be an instrument of Christ in receiving someone's sorrow, bringing forgiveness and helping the people move forward.

A priest hears a large number of confessions. He is not there to judge the person, but rather the nature of the sin, and to offer counsel and encouragement to overcome the sin and to grow spiritually. He too goes to confession, so he knows how it feels to confront one's own sins and ask for forgiveness.

**Why does the priest sometimes ask for more information?**

The priest may ask for additional information simply to clarify what happened, to understand if the action you confessed was a one-time situation or a pattern, and to assess the person's understanding of the situation.

### Q&A: Is it permissible to leave Mass early after Communion?

Imagine if some of your dinner guests gobbled their food and bolted when they finished. Not only would you think it rude, your other guests would find it distracting. Plus, they would miss out on the rest of the evening. The same is true for Mass. Jesus is present for the entire Mass, so slipping out before it is over is almost like walking out on him. Can you imagine meeting with an earthly king and leaving before he concluded your time together? Lastly, participating in Mass is intimately linked to our call to go forth and live the Gospel. The final blessing and dismissal prepares us to share what we have received with our brothers and sisters. If we leave directly after Communion, we miss this important component. Barring unusual circumstances, we should stay for the entire Mass and leave following the celebrant.

### Bishops Annual Appeal Results

In the name of Bishop Serratelli I would like to sincerely thank everyone from our parish who made a pledge or gift to our Bishop's Annual Appeal. Our goal for 2009 was \$30,700 and we pledged \$44,946 from 340 families. Our goal for 2008 was \$30,700 and we raised \$45,737 through your generosity. You should know that 50% of the money above our goal amount is returned to our parish to be used for our own charitable donations and support of our parish ministries.

For your information, the total Bishop's Annual Appeal 2009 results for the diocese was \$3,419,222 from 20,561 donors – which is basically even with the record amount that was pledged last year. Considering the on-going economic problems facing our country, it is encouraging that we met last year's pledge amount. I know Bishop Serratelli was very thankful and grateful to everyone who participated and once again, I believe this demonstrated our support of him as our Bishop. Thanks again.

### Liturgy Corner

In the following weeks, we will be breaking down the various elements of the liturgy and their purpose.

### Changes!!!

During the past couple of weeks two minor changes have occurred during our Masses. They concern our Pulpit Announcements and Reading of the Word.

First, Pulpit Announcements. In the past our announcements have taken place at the end of Mass, after communion. However, a closer look at the dynamics of the liturgy shows us the announcements would be better served by placing them at the *beginning of Mass* where they do not interfere with the flow and solemnity of the Liturgy. Liturgists tell us the first action of the liturgy is the gathering of the community. This gathering begins as we enter the parking lot, continues as we walk toward the church, goes on as we enter and find our pew, and flows to the opening song. However, as a continuation of our community gathering, a minister can share with us the community news through the announcements before the opening song is sung. All this serves to call and gather us as a particular community concerned about and interested in particular issues. The final act of community business before we are called to prayer is then to stand and sing, in one voice with one communal heart, the gathering song.

The Second minor change is the addition of Introductions to the Readings. These introductions are two or three lines. Their sole purpose is to help all of us "receive" and "hear" the word of God. They do not try to tilt the readings to fit a particular theme, tell anyone what they're supposed to get out of a reading, homilize, or moralize. They simply are a tool to try to give the context, the setting, explain a strange name, word or geographical locale, so that the assembly can take in whatever is being proclaimed.

Change can sometimes be uncomfortable. However, given some time, these two changes will soon fade from 'change' to 'ordinary'.

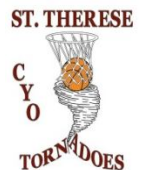
