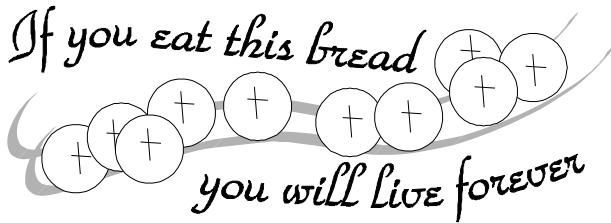

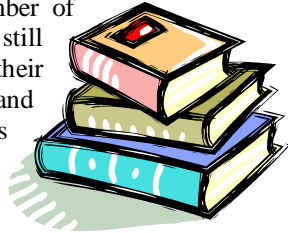

HURRICANE KATRINA "LEAD TO READ 1,000 BOOKS" DRIVE

Although time has passed, a number of parishes in New Orleans are still struggling to rebuild their infrastructures. Senior Girl Scout and parishioner Nina Rasmussen is committed to help in Marrero, Louisiana, where schools and students are in desperate need of books. Nina's Senior Gold Award project hopes to lead children to read, by providing a thousand books to the Marrero School District. Working with a 'Teach For America' teacher in Marrero, a need has been identified in these areas: fiction and non-fiction, critically in grades 4 – 12; secondarily in grades 1 – 3. Nina is also working cooperatively with Mrs. Bolger's St. Therese School Girl Scouts, who are collecting books (for a local women's shelter) for adults and young children, and with Mrs. Lauch's troop, which has also been collecting.



Nina is collecting gently used and new books and also accepting donations to cover the expense of shipping to New Orleans. Any extra funds will be used to purchase additional books from Scholastic at a special 50% discount. During the weekends of June 12/13th and June 19th/20th, Nina and her sister scouts will be in the Atrium after each Mass to accept donations of books and money.

Liturgy Corner

What is Liturgical Theology?

Theology is the study of God. Theologians try to understand who God is through a philosophical science. But most theology is secondary. That is, we all have an experience of God. We do not need philosophical sciences to tell us we have had that experience. Theology is the systematic reflection on the experience we have already had. The experience is first. The theology is second. But it is different with liturgy, as individuals, we come to know and experience God in many different ways. But as church, as a public body of believers, we experience the fullness of God, the "real presence" of God, primarily in the celebration of the liturgy.

This being the case, we say liturgy is primary theology. Another way the church has expressed this idea is by saying, "As the church prays, so it believes." In other words, if you want to know first and foremost what Christians believe about God, look at the way they pray ritually as a community. You can do this in two ways. You can go to lots of worship services and observe the way Christians pray. This is, in fact, what most people do who want to know what we believe. But suppose you wanted to make a fuller examination of Christian belief? Then, besides experiencing actual worship events, you could study the liturgical prayer books or ritual books of the community. Most Catholics do not realize what a wonder catechetical resource these books are. The mass has a prayer book or ritual book called a *missal* and every sacrament has a ritual book as well. Each of these books has an introduction, which gives directions and explanation about the ritual. The ritual itself contains instructions within it, giving directions about posture, gestures, minister's parts, vessel, symbols, and more. The prayers themselves tell us something about the public belief of the community. All these ritual books are in each parish--usually in the sacristy. They are also available in study editions from Catholic book stores.
