What is Liturgical Catechesis?

Liturgy Corner

Liturgical catechesis is sometimes thought to be a new trend in the church; however, it dates from the New Testament era.

The first example we have of liturgical catechesis is the Emmaus story. In that story, two friends were on a journey to the town of Emmaus. They had been followers of Jesus but were now uncertain of their commitment because Jesus had died. Yet they had heard an extraordinary bit of news. Apparently, Jesus had recently been seen alive by some other followers.

As they were discussing these things, they were joined by a third person who reminded them of many things Jesus had said. He stirred their faith and their interest. They invited the stranger to walk with them and eventually share dinner with them. Then, as the stranger broke the bread for the meal, they recognized him as Jesus.

This "breaking of the bread" was the same breaking of the bread Jesus had done at the Last Supper. It was the same breaking of the bread that was done in the very early liturgy of the New Testament era. For those followers, that ritual provided insight and clarity about who Jesus was, which is the crux of catechesis. The goal of catechesis is to know Jesus. It is in the liturgy--the breaking of the bread--that we most clearly see who Jesus is and come to know him.

"Liturgical catechesis," then, is almost a redundancy. All catechesis is ultimately liturgical in that all catechesis leads to and flows from the liturgy. It is important, however, to distinguish between *catechesis* and *religious education*. Catechesis is necessarily educational, but education is only a means to an end. Education without faith is not catechesis. It is possible, for example, to learn quite a bit about the history, doctrine, and rituals of Catholicism without having any faith in Jesus. It is also possible to learn a very minimal amount about history, doctrine, and rituals and yet have great faith. While catechesis can and does happen in a religious education program and a catechetical process does involve education, faith is the first goal of catechesis.

Liturgical catechesis is structured around the lectionary, the shape of the liturgy and the rhythm of the church year. By celebrating our faith through these sacred symbols and by reflecting on them in small faith-sharing groups such as Why Catholic, we come to learn all the essential elements of the faith. There is yet to be written a catechism that is more comprehensive and more nurturing to the faith than the liturgy itself.

Although time has passed, a number of parishes in New Orleans are still struggling to rebuild their infrastructures. Senior Girl Scout and parishioner Nina Rasmussen is committed to help in Marrero, Louisiana, where schools and students are in desperate need of books. Nina's Senior Gold Award project hopes to lead children to read, by providing a thousand books to the Marrero School District.
